They are three to share the Nobel Peace Prize: The Russian NGO Memorial, the Ukrainian Center for Civil Liberties and the Belarusian opponent Ales Bialiatski. The Nobel Committee says it wants to "honor three remarkable defenders of human rights". Alès Bialiatski is one of the initiators of the democratic movement which emerged in Belarus in the mid-1980s.

And Emmanuel Macron commented on this Nobel Peace Prize on Twitter, saying that these are "unwavering defenders of human rights in Europe. Artisans of peace, they know they can count on the support of France."

You have probably seen them or, worse, you have experienced them: The endless queues to fill up at the pump. 15% of French gas stations are experiencing fuel supply problems as a consequence of the strike in TotalEnergies refineries. Prime Minister Élisabeth Borne calls on the management of oil groups and staff representatives to take responsibility.
