New rules for French hunters: The government presents its plan to make this practice safer. The measures include the implementation of a blood alcohol offense. Hunters will be limited to 0.5 grams of alcohol per liter of blood, as for motorists. According to a Senate report, alcohol is the cause of 9% of hunting accidents. The government plan also provides that hunters be better trained in first aid, and in particular in treating wounds.

750 euros is the maximum amount that drivers of polluting cars who do not respect ZFEs may have to pay. This concerns the low-emission zones set up in large cities such as Paris, Marseilles or Toulouse. The fines will be drawn up from the second half of 2024 via automated devices. The Minister for Ecological Transition, Christophe Béchu, promises greater financial aid for low-income households to change cars.

The RATP is launching an attendance bonus to fight against absenteeism of bus drivers in the Paris region. Drivers who will not have had any absences for a month will receive a 100-euro bonus, 150 additional euros in the second month, and 200 euros after three months. The system is in place until the end of the year.

And a 16-year-old boy is charged and imprisoned in Roanne. The young man is accused of sexual assault on a 6-year-old girl. He was beaten up by the victim's family, before being handed over to the police. This unaccompanied minor, who resides in a specialized structure, disputes the charges against him.

Rishi Sunak is officially the new Prime Minister of the United Kingdom. The former finance minister was appointed today by King Charles III during a meeting at Buckingham Palace. His first mission is to form a government able to lift the struggling British economy.

And then in soccer, the PSG will be on the field this evening for the fifth day of the Champions League. The Parisians receive Maccabi Haifa for a match under high security with 800 policemen and gendarmes mobilized on site. Kickoff at 9 p.m.
