Agnès Pannier-Runacher is being accused of conflict of interests. The Minister for Energy Transition is singled out for having hidden the existence of a family business linked to the oil industry - A business fueled by funds in tax havens, according to the investigative media. Questioned on this subject at the National Assembly, Agnès Pannier-Runacher denounces "false and slanderous allegations". She claims she "does not benefit" from the funds of this company.

The leaders of the fifty most CO2-emitting French industrial sites were received this afternoon at the Elysée. This includes cement works, chemical plants and sugar production sites. The objective is to think about ways to continue to produce in France, while polluting less. These industries represent about 20% of our greenhouse gas emissions.

In Deux-Sèvres, the site of the mega basin resumed this morning in Sainte-Soline. The site had been the scene of a demonstration ten days ago and environmental activists say they are ready for a new gathering on an even larger scale.

The Public Prosecutor's Office of Marseille opens a preliminary investigation after the confessions of Cardinal Ricard. The former head of the bishops of France confessed to having had reprehensible behavior towards a teenager 35 years ago. In all, ten other bishops are implicated in cases of sexual abuse.

And the Americans are called to vote today for the midterm elections. They must appoint a large part of their representatives to Congress. For the Democrats, the goal is to keep their very narrow parliamentary majority to allow Joe Biden to pursue his program. But traditionally these midterms turn to the advantage of the opposition. Moreover, according to the polls, the Republicans have a strong chance of winning a majority in the House of Representatives.
