It is out of the question to cut off the dialogue. Emmanuel Macron will continue to speak to Vladimir Poutine, who will be absent from the G20 that will begin tomorrow in Bali in Indonesia. Moreover, the French president has promised to call his Russian counterpart after the summit which ends on Wednesday, with always the same objective: to try to find a way to peace in Ukraine.

And in Ukraine, Volodymyr Zelensky made a surprise trip today to Karson - this strategic city in the south of the country which was taken back by Kiev after 8 months of occupation by the Russian army. Joe Biden declared that this is an important but remains uncertain about the regarding the outcome of the war.

In France, 95% of medical analysis laboratories are closed today, as a consequence of the strike of liberal biologists. They will be mobilized until Wednesday to denounce the bill on the 2023 Social Security budget. The text provides for a cut of 250 million euros for their sector of activity.

He wants to go to court. The MP of *La France Insoumise*, Louis Boyard, announces his intention to file a complaint against Cyril Hanouna. The elected representative of Val de Marne was insulted last week on the air by the host of "*Touche pas à mon poste*", after his remarks against Vincent Bolloré, the owner of the channel C8.

It's only a matter of days: The candidacy of Jean Castex for the head of the RATP has been validated by the company's board of directors. The former Prime Minister is expected to take up his position after the Council of Ministers on November 23.

And then soccer and a last-minute change for *Les Bleus*: 6 days before the World Cup, the PSG defender Presnel Kimpembé, injured, is replaced by the Monegasque Axel Disasi. Coach Didier Deschamps has also called up a 26th player, the striker Marcus Thuram. Les Bleus are currently preparing in Clairefontaine before their departure for Qatar on Wednesday.
