The bill on unemployment insurance is adopted by Parliament, thus opening the way to a modulation of compensation according to the economic situation. In concrete terms: the rules of compensation will be stricter when too many jobs remain unfilled, and more generous when unemployment is high. This was Emmanuel Macron's campaign promise. Consultation is underway with social partners, and the government will communicate on the arbitrations adopted by next Monday.

The government remains opposed to the reintegration of caregivers who are not vaccinated against the Covid. According to government spokesperson Olivier Véran, reintegrating these caregivers would not solve the difficulties faced by hospitals. The High Authority for Health had recommended last summer to maintain this vaccination obligation. The MPs of La France Insoumise submitted a bill to reinstate suspended personnel thanks to a reinforced health protocol.

"Valeurs Actuelles" is sentenced by the Paris Court of Appeal. The director of the far-right weekly, as well as a journalist were sentenced to a suspended fine of 1,000 euros for "racist insult" towards the MP of *La France Insoumise*, Danièle Obono, portrayed as a slave. They will also have to pay him 5,000 euros in damages.

Almost two years after a 25-year-old man was shot dead by a hunter who had mistaken him for a wild boar, the prosecutor of Cahors requests 6 months in prison for the shooter and the leader of the hunt. The prosecutor also wants their hunting license permanently withdrawn.

And to finish: It's a tradition every third Thursday of November: The Beaujolais Nouveau arrives out today! But the production is lower due to the difficult weather conditions. Last year nearly 18 million bottles were marketed and mainly exported to Japan and the United States. To be consumed, of course, in moderation.
