Prime Minister Élisabeth Borne announces a 100-euro check for low-income households that will replace the fuel rebate in 2023. To finance this aid, the government has released a 1-billion-euro budget.

There will be no disaster situation, says the government. France will hold out this winter as the risk of power cuts continues to worry. Agnès Pannier-Runacher has promised that the executive will follow people at risk in the event of electricity cuts. The Minister for Energy Transition announced this on BFM TV, after Enedis - in charge of managing the electricity network - had indicated that people who are at high vital risk will not be among the priority customers in the event of cuts.

How to slow down the progression of the 9th wave of COVID in France? The Minister of Health François Braun will provide answers on Friday during a press conference. The government is considering making masks mandatory once again in transportation.

In China, Beijing is relaxing its zero-Covid policy in response to the wave of protests that has shaken the country for several weeks. Some positive cases will now be able to carry out their quarantine at home instead of being placed in solitary confinement in centers.
