Argentina's football team landed in Buenos Aires this morning and was greeted by hordes of fans who were all delighted that they had brought the World Cup trophy back home with them. After winning Sunday's final, the fans who had come out to welcome back Lionel Messi and his teammates were treated to glimpses of the trophy that is the highest honour in football and that means Argentina is the best team in the world. The entire country has been granted a public holiday today so that everyone can celebrate when the players show off the trophy at the official ceremony at the Obelisk, Buenos Aires' monument to sporting achievements, at noon today.

And it may be more of a bittersweet return for France's team, who have come back the runners up, but that didn't stop 50,000 football fans showing up to Paris' Place de la Concorde last night to welcome home team France.

Could Donald Trump be facing criminal charges?
