The fear of power cuts this winter is receding a little. The RTE has lowered the risk of an electricity shortage to "medium". It has been considered as "high" until now. However, the manager of the electricity transmission network does not exclude the possibility of cuts in the event of very unfavorable weather conditions.

For its part, EDF has announced that two additional nuclear reactors will ultimately not be able to restart before the end of this winter, and that 6 others will have to be shut down in 2023 for repairs related to corrosion problems. Currently, 16 nuclear reactors out of 56 are shut down in France. Never has EDF produced so little nuclear electricity in its history.

Getting around Paris will now cost more. The Navigo pass will rise from 75 to just over 84 euros per month. Users can buy their pass for the month of January.
