Should negative tests be required at borders for travelers from China? The European Commission is convening a meeting today to discuss possible steps in this direction. The aim is to put in place a coordinated approach between all European countries, as China faces an explosion in cases of Covid since the end of the zero covid policy. Italy, Japan, but also the United States have decided to reinstate tests for all travelers coming from China.

In the hospital of Remiremont, in the Vosges, four patients died in mysterious and unexplained circumstances between 2018 and 2022. Their families have decided to file a complaint for "involuntary homicide". A fifth complaint will soon be filed. Questioned several times, the hospital does not recognize any professional misconduct.

The allowance for disabled adults will be calculated individually from October 2023. The decree has been published in the Official Journal. The amount of aid will no longer take the spouse's income into account. According to the government, with this reform, 120,000 disabled couples will see their allowance increase by 350 euros per month on average.

And the Great Mosque of Paris is filing a complaint against Michel Houellebecq for "provoking hatred against Muslims", after the writer's statements in the magazine *Front Populaire* a few weeks ago, in which he mentioned attacks and shootings in mosques as an act of resistance. The rector of the Great Mosque of Paris denounces "unacceptable statements of astounding brutality".

And Ukraine was hit again this morning by a salvo of Russian missiles. More than a hundred in several cities of the country. In Kyiv, explosions caused at least three injuries and in Lviv, in the west, 90% of the city no longer has electricity. The head of Russian diplomacy, Sergei Lavrov, said he was "convinced" that Russia would achieve its objectives in Ukraine by dint of "patience".
