Binyamin Netanyahu officially becomes Prime Minister of Israel again following a vote in Parliament. 63 MPs out of 120 voted in favor of his government, which is the most right-wing government in the country's history. Binyamin Netanyahu has already been Prime Minister from 1996 to 1999, and from 2009 to 2021.

European countries will establish a common strategy to avoid a resurgence of coronavirus cases coming from China, as contaminations surge in the country. Representatives of the Ministries of Health of the member countries met today to discuss the issue. Italy has already decided to impose compulsory tests on all travelers coming from China. The same decision was made in Japan and in the United States. However, according to the European Center of disease prevention and control, this measure is unjustified.

The Council of State definitively authorizes the sale of CBD flowers and leaves, thus going against the government which had prohibited it in a decree. According to the Council of State, CBD, derived from cannabis, does not have a psychotropic effect, does not cause addiction, and therefore cannot be considered as a narcotic. The ban on its sale is therefore deemed illegal.

As a reminder, alcohol is involved in one third of car accidents.

And then Great Mosque of Paris is filing a complaint against Michel Houellebecq for "provoking hatred against Muslims". The writer stated in the magazine *Front Populaire* a few weeks ago that attacks and shootings in mosques are an act of resistance. The rector of the Great Mosque of Paris denounces "unacceptable statements with astonishing brutality".
