"We are opposed to raising the legal age of retirement", says Cyril Chabanier. The president of the CFTC came out a few minutes ago from his meeting with the Prime Minister, Elisabeth Borne. According to him, the government has decided on a retirement age at 64 years old. Cyril Chabanier warns that the CFTC will fight this reform.

France should, in the end, avoid power cuts this winter. This is what government spokesman Olivier Véran tells us following the Council of Ministers. According to him, the latest indicators are "rather reassuring", thanks to the gradual resumption of the operation of our nuclear power plants, favourable weather conditions, and the efforts of energy sobriety made by the population.

More than 6 years after his disappearance, the skull of Éric Foray was discovered in the Vercors. At 47, at the time of his disappearance, he had left his home, in the Drôme, to go shopping but never returned. The discovery of his skull reopens the investigation into his disappearance.

The flu is losing ground in France. *Santé Publique France* tells us that the number of people suffering from flu-like symptoms was down by more than 25% last week, just like the number of emergency room admissions for such symptoms. The agency warns against a possible rebound after the end of year holidays.

And the government prohibits the sale of paracetamol online until January 31. There are currently supply difficulties, in particular for forms intended for children. For several months, the National Medicines Safety Agency has been asking pharmacists to ration the sale of paracetamol to each patient. The situation is aggravated by China's decision to ban the export of the molecule as the country is experiencing an explosion in cases of coronavirus.

And then in Handball, the French team is playing its first preparation match tonight for the world championship which begins next week. *Les Bleus* will face the Netherlands at 8:45 p.m.
