The government prohibits hunting under the influence of alcohol or drugs. This was announced by the Secretary of State for Ecology, Bérangère Couillard. And the government has, in the end, ruled out the idea of establishing a day without hunting.

Noël Le Graët apologizes to Zinedine Zidane. The president of the French soccer federation acknowledges his clumsy remark. In an interview yesterday, Noël le Graët said that he "couldn't care less" if Zidane were to train the Brazilian team. The Minister of Sports, Amélie Oudéa-Castéra, reacted on Twitter, saying that "the president of the first sports federation in France should not have said that".

The Mediator appeal trial opens today in Paris. The Servier laboratories are retried, two years after their conviction to a fine of more than 2.5 million euros for aggravated fraud. As a reminder, the antidiabetic drug is being held responsible for hundreds of deaths. 6,700 victims are civil parties in this unprecedented health scandal. The trial is scheduled to last about six months.

President Lula will return to work in his offices in Brasilia after yesterday's invasion of the presidential palace, Congress and the Supreme Court by activists of former President Jair Bolsonaro. The offices and furniture have been damaged. More than 300 people were arrested. According to Lula, "Those who financed these demonstrations will pay for these irresponsible and anti-democratic acts."

The Avignon festival will take place at a different time of year in 2024 due to the Paris Olympic Games. Instead of July, the event will begin at the end of June, according to the Minister of Culture. As a result, and just for Avignon, the summer school holidays will start three days earlier.

And then the two Corsican departments are placed under orange weather alert for strong winds. Météo France warns that very strong gusts of wind are expected this evening, reaching up to 140 kilometers per hour.
