The CGT Mines-Energie threatens to cut off the power in the offices of the parliamentarians who vote for the pension reform, as part of the mobilization against the text tomorrow. At the same time the union could also restore the power for the most precarious households. But for Fabrice Coudour, federal secretary of the CGT Mines-Énergie, these modes of action will only intervene as a last resort.

In the meantime, 200 demonstrations are planned all over the country tomorrow. Many sectors such as transportation and education will be very disrupted by the strike.

In Rambouillet, a mother and her 2 children died in the fire of a building. The fire started early this morning in their apartment located on the 3rd floor. About forty firefighters are mobilized on site. All the inhabitants of the building have been evacuated.

Charles Michel deplores the death of a great friend of the European Union. The President of the European Council paid tribute to the Ukrainian Minister of the Interior who died in the crash of a helicopter near Kyiv. The aircraft crashed this morning near a nursery school. As a result of this crash, 18 people have died including 3 children.

The defending champion was defeated in 3 sets against the American McDonald. The Spaniard was injured at the hip.
