After the discovery of human remains in the pipes of an apartment, in Saint-Priest, the suspect will be brought before a court. He will be presented to an investigating judge for a possible indictment. This 28-year-old man, treated for psychiatric disorders, is accused of having killed and then cut up the body of a 17-year-old teenager.

The circuit Court of the North pronounces sentences of 10 to 20 years in prison against four defendants for having tortured and almost beaten to death - over two weeks - a two-year-old child, in 2018 in Auberchicourt. The court has revoked the mother from her parental authority. The now 7-year-old child suffered significant neurological and psychological damage.

In the midst of a debate on pension reform, Rémy Rebeyrotte, elected by the Majority and MP of Saône et Loire, submitted a text today in the National Assembly. The text is intended for people involved in associations. He proposes that officials with more than 15 years of activity as president, treasurer or secretary, be granted 2 additional quarters. The MP explains that this would make it possible to recognize the commitment of these volunteers.

And confusion surrounds the election of the first secretary of the Socialist Party. While the re-election of the outgoing first secretary, Olivier Faure, has been announced, his rival, Nicolas Mayer-Rossignol, contests the results. According to the mayor of Rouen, he won the ballot. He assures that he will not back down from exercising the rights of activists. And accuses Olivier Faure of "damaging" the Socialist Party by dividing it. The winner must be officially inducted at the 80th congress of the PS, next week in Marseille.

And 400 billion euros will be allocated for the budget of the army. This budget, announced by Emmanuel Macron, will cover the period going from 2024 to 2030. This is a third more than the previous budget of 295 billion. The Credits of the military intelligence services will increase by around 60%. The objective, according to the Head of State, is to have increased intelligence capacities that will enable crises or threats to be anticipated.
