Meanwhile, strike movements are being organized today and tomorrow in refineries, power plants, but also ports and docks. According to the CGT, this morning there were 100% of strikers at the depot of Flanders, 80% at the Normandy refinery and 60% at the La Mède biorefinery. For its part, EDF deplores power plants idling with a loss of power. However, these drops in production will not cause power outages.
