The MPs resumed this evening the examination of the bill on the reform of pensions at the Assembly and now, it is a race against time. It is necessary to examine 18 articles, in particular the one which pushes back the legal age of retirement to 64 years old and more than 16,000 amendments before the deadline set for Friday midnight. The text must then be presented before the Senate.

And the unions remain determined to make the government give in. The CGT has called on several professions, including railway workers, to strike on Thursday - date of the next day of action against the pension reform. Other sectors could also be involved such as energy and education. The objective is to maintain pressure on the executive before the mobilization scheduled for March 7.

The investigation continues 3 days after the road accident involving Pierre Palmade in Seine et Marne. The comedian was driving under the influence of cocaine. His home was searched, and the police also found his cell phone which will be examined. The 2 passengers present in the vehicle and who fled the scene have still not been identified. As for the 3 people injured in the collision, they are still hospitalized this evening in critical condition.

A macabre discovery was made in Paris. The remains of a human body were found today in a bag in the Buttes-Chaumont Park. According to the first elements the victim seems to be a woman. The investigators of the criminal brigade were seized by the Paris prosecutor's office.

And a few more weeks remain to apply for the 100-euro fuel allowance set up by the government, as the system will be extended until the end of March. This was confirmed by the Minister of Economy Bruno Le Maire. 10 million low-income drivers can benefit from this allowance if they use their car to go to work.
