It's the home stretch for the pension reform in the National Assembly. MPs will examine the text until midnight, in an atmosphere which once again promises to be tense. It remains to be seen whether the elected officials will have the time to address article 7 which acts the postponement of the retirement age. Moreover, it is from midnight that the motion of censure submitted by the Rassemblement National will be debated, but the motion has no chance of being adopted.

Emmanuel Macron is in Munich for a conference on security. This is an opportunity for Westerners to take stock of the war in Ukraine, almost a year after the start of the conflict. According to the Elysée, Emmanuel Macron's speech will focus on ways to get out of the crisis and ensure Russia's defeat.

And the police custody of Pierre Palmade will end early this afternoon. Involved in a serious road accident, the comedian risks an indictment, after driving under the influence of narcotics. An investigation was opened for "manslaughter" and "involuntary injuries". During his police custody Pierre Palmade expressed his "shame" and said he was "devastated" by the consequences of his actions.

In Nantes, a was man hospitalized in absolute emergency after falling from the fourth floor of a building last night. The 25-year-old man supposedly jumped out of the window.

And historic losses for EDF in 2022: The electricity supplier recorded a loss of nearly 18 billion euros. Its debt now exceeds 64 billion. EDF has had difficulties of its reactors, especially due to corrosion.

And then France is preparing for a weekend of traffic on the roads. All zones will be affected by the school holidays. Traffic is orange today in Ile-de-France and in the South-West for departures. It will be the most complicated tomorrow, when traffic will be red for the eastern half of the country, especially in the direction of ski resorts.
