An investigation for murder has been opened following the death of a teacher this morning in Saint Jean de Luz. She was fatally stabbed by a student at the Saint-Thomas-d'Aquin private high school. The suspect is a 16-year-old teenager who was arrested and is currently in police custody. The Minister of Education Pap Ndiaye was on site to express his support for the teaching community.

He also announced that a minute of silence will be observed tomorrow in all schools at 3 p.m. in memory of the victim.

In the rest of the news. The court confirms the responsibility of the State in the death of Rémi Fraisse. The 21-year-old activist was killed by an offensive grenade used by the gendarmerie on the ZAD of the dam of Sivens in the Tarn in 2014. The Toulouse Administrative Court of Appeal sentenced the State to pay nearly 60 thousand euros for the moral damage caused to the victim's family. The gendarme who had used the grenade remains cleared in this case.

The requisitions were communicated at the trial of the fire in rue Erlanger before the Paris circuit Court. 27 years in prison were requested against the defendant. The 44-year-old woman had set fire to the second floor of her Parisian building in February of 2019. The incident killed ten people and injured dozens of others. The verdict is expected tomorrow.
