The police custody has been extended for the teenager suspected of having killed his Spanish teacher yesterday in a high school in Saint-Jean-de-Luz. The 16-year-old male may suffer from psychological disorders according to the first elements of the investigation. The tragedy is causing questioning on the issue of medico-social follow-up of pupils. This morning the Minister of Education Pap Ndiaye recalled the recruitment last year of an additional 20% of school psychologists and 50 nurses and social workers. These figures, however, are far from sufficient for Gwénaëlle Durand, general secretary of the union of school nurses.

A minute of silence will be observed at 3 p.m. in all middle schools and high schools in tribute to Agnès Lassalle, the teacher fatally stabbed yesterday as she was teaching.

The verdict is expected today at the trial of the fire in building of rue Erlanger in Paris. 27 years in prison were requested against the woman accused of having set fire to the building 4 years ago. The fire had resulted in 10 deaths and several injuries.

In the rest of the news, are we soon going to pay more at the doctor's office? Social Security proposes an increase in the price of consultations to meet the demands of health professionals.
