Emotion and remembrance today in all middle schools and high schools of France. A minute of silence was observed this afternoon to pay tribute to the Spanish teacher killed yesterday by a 16-year-old student in the Thomas d'Aquin private school of Saint Jean de Luz. She was stabbed as she was teaching class. The public prosecutor of Bayonne gave a press conference today to discuss in particular the psychological state of the suspect.

The prosecutor will request the detention of the teenager whom he deems criminally responsible.

The verdict was given at the trial of the fatal fire in rue Erlanger in Paris. The Court sentenced the main defendant to 25 years in prison. The 44-year-old woman had set fire to her own building in February 2019. The fire then killed 10 people.
