The G7 countries met by videoconference this afternoon; one year to the day after the start of the war in Ukraine. On Twitter, Emmanuel Macron recalls that the G7 is united and determined to achieve victory and obtain the return of peace. The Foreign Minister Catherine Colonna calls on Russia to withdraw its troops from Ukraine immediately and without conditions.

A second man is in police custody in relation to the investigation for child pornography which targets Pierre Palmade. The court took up the case after a report was made to the police. In parallel, regarding the road accident of the comedian, he will know on Monday if he is remanded in custody or if he remains in the hospital. This was decided this morning by the investigation chamber of the Paris Court of Appeal.

The teenager suspected of having killed his Spanish teacher in Saint-Jean-de-Luz is indicted for murder. The 16-year-old young man was also placed in pre-trial detention. According to his lawyer, it will take several months of expertise to be able to understand what happened.

And Elisabeth Borne intends to devote 100 billion euros to the development of rail transport over the next two decades. The Prime Minister is betting in particular on the creation of metropolitan RERs. The urban areas of Lille, Rouen, Nantes, Bordeaux, Toulon and even Mulhouse are concerned. In addition, additional investments will be made for the maintenance of the network.

They may join the movement against the pension reform. Those who work for meal delivery platforms, such as Uber Eats and Deliveroo, are called by the CGT to strike on March 7 - Date on which the unions have promised to bring France to a standstill. According to the CGT, the sum of pension contributions not paid by delivery platforms could amount to tens of millions of euros.

And then in rugby, only one change for the XV of France: Mohammed Aouas replaces Uini Atonio as the mainstay to face Scotland on Sunday for the third match of the 6 Nations tournament. Despite the defeat against Ireland two weeks ago, coach Fabien Galthié retains the rest of his team, including Antoine Dupont, Romain Ntamack and Damian Penaud.
