His answer is expected during the day. Emmanuel Macron will send a letter to the inter-union, which asks to be received urgently by the Head of State as part of the standoff engaged around the pension reform. In the meantime, the mobilization continues with most of the refineries blocked and still disruptions in trains and airports. This is also the 5th day of strike for garbage collectors in Paris. The depots of ten arrondissements and 2 incinerators have been shut down since Tuesday. Despite the garbage piling up in the streets, the strikers remain determined.

Garbage collectors are also mobilizing for better wages. They will be received on this subject this afternoon at the town hall.

Also in the news, at least eight people have died following a shooting last night in Germany. The tragedy took place in a religious center of Jehovah's Witnesses in Hamburg. The alleged assailant is said to have died. The motive has yet to be determined.

Pierre Palmade will have to wait. The Paris Court of Appeal will finally render its decision on Tuesday morning concerning the provisional detention of the comedian. The investigating judge of Melun challenges the release under judicial supervision because of his state of health.

And then strong winds are blowing hard in the South-East. Météo France has placed several departments under orange weather alert for "violent winds". This concerns the Pyrénées-Orientales, Aude, Hérault, Corsica, Alpes Maritimes, and the Var. Gusts reaching up to 140 km/h in mountainous areas are expected and up to 200 km/h in Corsica.
