Fewer police forces will be mobilized tomorrow to supervise the demonstrations against pension reform. Minister of the interior Gérald Darmanin announces 11,500 police and gendarmes, including 4,200 in Paris. Last week, 13,000 civil servants were deployed throughout France.

And the citizen petition demanding the dissolution of Brav-M collected 265,000 signatures and will be examined this afternoon by the Law Commission at the National Assembly. This motorized brigade in Paris was singled out after the problems that occurred on the sidelines of protests against pension reform.

In Italy, there is concern about the state of health of Silvio Berlusconi. The 86-year-old former head of the Italian government was hospitalized in intensive care for a heart problem. The billionaire had already undergone open heart surgery in 2016.

Two people were injured after a fishing boat overturned this morning off Barfleur in the English Channel. The two surviving sailors were evacuated by helicopter to the hospital center in Le Havre. Emergency services are still mobilized on site to try to find another missing person.

And then preparations are moving forward in the UK, a month away from the coronation of King Charles 3. Buckingham Palace has unveiled the official invitation to the event scheduled for May 6 at Westminster Abbey, London. A spring-themed invitation was sent to nearly 2,000 guests, which clarifies the definitive title of Camilla who bears the title of queen, when she was until now queen consort.
