The police force was this evening in front of the constitutional council. This is where the text on the pension reform will be examined tomorrow. The decision of the council is eagerly awaited, to say the least. For fear of misbehaviours, the Ministry of the Interior has asked the Paris police headquarters to prohibit any demonstration in front of the institution. A decree has just been published along those lines.

And in the meantime, the opponents of the pension reform are not giving up. They have demonstrated for the 12th time since the beginning of the year, even if they are much less in the streets. In Nantes, 10 thousand people according to the prefecture 25,000 according to unions. In Bordeaux they were 6 thousand according to the prefecture and 40 thousand according to unions. Each time it there is a reduction in mobilization compared to previous week.

A terrible discovery was made in the Pas de Calais. The body of a lifeless baby was found last week in a plastic container, on the edge of a field in Huclier, west of Arras. His death supposedly dates back to several weeks. An investigation has been opened to determine the cause of the infant's death and the identity of its parents.

Australia is preparing for a tropical storm. The weather services announce violent winds which raise fears of significant human and material damage. Forecasters predict gusts that could reach 315 kilometers per hour, which would make it one of the most powerful cyclones to hit the country in ten years. Authorities in Western Australia have issued a "red alert" and ordered evacuations.

And a new song was unveiled just now by Céline Dion. The singer has posted an unreleased title, from the soundtrack of the film "Love Again, un peu, beaucoup, passionément" - A romantic comedy in which the star plays herself. The film will be in theaters at the beginning of June and her complete album will be available in 1 month, on May 12th with 5 new songs by Celine Dion.
