Emmanuel Macron wants to meet with the social partners at the end of the year to build the new pact for working life. He wants to continue to move forward by turning the page on the pension reform. The head of the State received today the representatives of the employers' organizations, the Medef, the Confederation of SMEs and the Union of local businesses. A meeting in which the inter-union refused to participate. At the end, the president of the Medef Geoffroy Roux de Bézieux said that he wants the unions to join the negotiations.

Emmanuel Macron will be in the Bas-Rhin tomorrow, in Muttersholtz. A trip on the theme of work. He will visit a company specializing in wooden constructions, responsible for designing buildings for the 2024 Olympics.

Work-related diseases have risen sharply in ten years in France, according to Santé Public France. Occupational diseases are on the rise but remain too often undeclared, mostly because of the fear of losing one's job. Women are the most affected. Musculoskeletal disorders and psychological suffering are the most frequently reported pathologies.

A shooting results in four people injured, including three seriously in Marseille. Several shots were fired last night on the outskirts of the cite Félix Pyat near a drug sales point. No suspect has yet been arrested. Since the beginning of the year, shootings in Marseille have already claimed the lives of 15 people.

The European Parliament adopts the reform of the carbon market. The text should make it possible to achieve the greenhouse gas reduction objectives of the Twenty-Seven with a decrease in 55% by 2030 compared to the beginning of the 90s. European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen intends to make Europe the first climate-neutral continent.

And then in tennis, a few weeks before Roland-Garros, the list of qualifiers for the main draws has been unveiled. At least sixteen French people will be on the Parisian clay court, including Caroline Garcia, Alizé Cornet, Richard Gasquet and Benjamin Bonzi. The Roland-Garros tournament will begin on May 28.
