Emmanuel Macron booed in Alsace. The opponents of the pension reform were waiting for him. "No one is happy to work two more years", said the President, while affirming that the country must move forward. He was, a little earlier, greeted by a concert of saucepans. He then stated that "It is not saucepans that will move France forward".

In the Paris region, a hundred of CGT activists gathered in the 4 Temps shopping center in Puteaux. They are demanding the withdrawal of the pension reform. The management closed the store to the public at the end of the morning.

In the midst of the fight against the reform, a page is turning at the CFDT. Laurent Berger announces that he will leave his functions as Secretary General on June 21. In an interview with the newspaper Le Monde, he indicates that he is giving up his place to Marylise Léon, current number two of the confederation. Laurent Berger had taken the head of the CFDT in 2012. He claims not to want to engage in politics. Among the reactions to this departure, Emmanuel Macron stated that he has "respect" and even a "friendship" with the of the CFDT.

A call for witnesses was launched in Le Mans after the death of a 4-year-old child hit by a car on Monday afternoon. The intervention of emergency services did not save him. The driver, who was driving at high speed, fled the scene and is actively wanted.
