The tariff shield on electricity is extended until the beginning of 2025. This was announced this morning by the Minister of Economy, Bruno Le Maire. The system put in place in 2021 to deal with soaring energy prices has made it possible to limit the increase in prices for individuals. On the other hand, the tariff shield on gas is soon over. It will be lifted next July, as gas prices have started to drop.

Also in the news, her visit is also likely to be eventful. The Prime Minister, Elisabeth Borne, is traveling to Indre today, to a Maison France Service. The inter-union calls for demonstrations to the sound of pots and whistles to protest against the pension reform.
