Today marks a year since Emmanuel Macron was re-elected for the second time as President of France. Today is a time to take stock for the Head of State. In an interview with the newspaper *Le Parisien*, the president gave an update on his five-year term. He still stands by his recent pension reform which has been the reason for so many recent strikes. The left-wing party La France Insoumise is calling on the French public to clang saucepans outside of every town hall this evening at 8pm.

The association the Right to Housing is calling for an end to what it calls a "brutal" and "anti-poor" operation. The association has called for the Wuambushu project to be stopped in Mayotte. The operation, which is due to start this week, will set out to dislodge irregular migrants from slums of the French department and expel undocumented migrants. Several hundred law enforcement officers are deployed on site.

The President of Algeria, President Abdelmadjid Tebboune, will be in France on a state visit in June, with a view to strengthening diplomatic relations between France and Algeria. The trip had originally been planned for May. The Algerian President will meet with Emmanuel Macron, in a bid for both countries to step up their efforts to rebuild a more peaceful relationship.

A judicial inquiry for intentional homicide has been opened near Angers after a man was shot in the head yesterday morning. The man in his 30s was in a nightclub at the time he was shot. The murderer is still at large.

And finally the Molières awards ceremony will be taking place tonight at the Théâtre de Paris. Among the nominees are two favourites, the plays "Glenn, naissance d'un prodige" and "Big Mother". The ceremony gets underway at 8:30 p.m.
