It's time to take stock for Emmanuel Macron, a year to the day after the President was re-elected. This is an opportunity to look back on the first twelve months of this second term, marked in particular by the highly contested pension reform. In an interview with *Le Parisien*, Emmanuel Macron said he regretted not having been "present enough" with regard to this reform. For Gaspard Gantzer, former adviser to François Hollande at the Elysée, the head of the state must now learn the lessons of this crisis.

Among Emmanuel Macron's next priority projects are immigration, ecology and the fight against unemployment.

In the rest of the news, doctor appointments will cost more from the end of the year. 26 euros and 50 cents with a general practitioner against 25 euros currently. The price will rise to 31 euros 50 with a specialist according to the arbitrations presented today to the unions of liberal doctors. They must still be validated by the Minister of Health François Braun.

In Mayotte, operation Wuambushu is due to begin in the next few days - maybe even in the next few hours. France plans to dislodge irregular migrants from the slums of this French department and deport thousands of undocumented foreign migrants most of whom are Comorians.

And then a heat wave is expected in Spain. From tomorrow, the country will experience scorching temperatures for the season, with up to 40 degrees, mainly in the south. This exceptional phenomenon is expected to last until Saturday.
