Elisabeth Borne detailed today the government's roadmap with the objective of turning the page on the pension reform and set the course for the rest of the five-year term. The Prime Minister unveiled several priority projects: achieving full employment, reindustrializing France, planning and accelerating the ecological transition and rebuilding public services. She also wants to build a new pact with the unions by the summer by improving the income of employees and developing the employment of seniors.

In the rest of the news, an investigation has been opened after the death of a 5-year-old girl in the Vosges. Her body was found yesterday afternoon in a garbage bag, in an apartment in Rambervilé, where a 16-year-old boy was taken into custody. The suspect is already known to the police, after being indicted in the past for acts of sexual assault, rape and violence.

The man who was seriously injured during the gathering in Sainte-Soline on March 25th is still in critical condition. The 32-year-old man was hit by a tear gas canister during violent clashes between demonstrators and the police.

And there is good news for employment in France: Unemployment fell in the 1st quarter by 1.2% according to the figures released today. The number of category A job seekers amounts to just over 3 million people.

And abroad, a historic reform in the Vatican: Pope Francis has decided to give women the right to vote at the next major meeting of bishops that it will take place in October in Rome. A change without precedent that responds to a request made for several decades by women in the church.
