What will become of the movement against pension reform? The unions met by videoconference this morning to establish a common strategy. Prime Minister Elisabeth Borne will send an invitation to the inter-union in the coming days. It remains to be seen whether this invitation will be accepted. The secretary General of the CFDT Laurent Berger has already announced that he will talk with the Prime Minister - Same goes for the CFTC.

540 arrests were made in France on the sidelines of the demonstrations of May 1st. This was announced by Gérald Darmanin. The Minister of the Interior said that 406 police officers and gendarmes were injured. One of them is still hospitalized, burned on the face due to a Molotov cocktail.

Gérald Darmanin calls for firm criminal sanctions against those who attack the police, he pleads for an "anti-thug" law. On the demonstrators' side, around sixty were injured throughout France.

There were injuries but also damage in city centers. In Lyon, Mayor Grégory Doucet asks the State to set up a compensation fund for shop owners who are victims of this violence. He calls on national solidarity.

An investigation was opened in Vaucluse after the death of two men, shot dead last night in Cavaillon. They were in a car near the train station. A third man was also injured in a district known to be a point of drug sales. We do not know if the victims had criminal records.

Film and television scriptwriters are going on strike in Hollywood after the failure of negotiations with the main studios. They demand better salaries, linked in particular to the profits generated by online platforms. As a consequence, delays are to be expected in the distribution of future films and series.

And then soccer with the end of the 33rd day of Premier League this evening. The winner of the Coupe de France, Toulouse, receives Lens. Kick-off 9 p.m. After the match, the trophy won Saturday evening against Nantes will be presented to the Toulouse public during a ceremony.
