"A new line has been crossed in the violence", says Elisabeth Borne. The Prime Minister raises her voice after the attack on a police officer yesterday in Paris on the sidelines of the demonstrations of May 1st. The policeman was seriously injured after being hit by a Molotov cocktail. He is still hospitalized. His attacker has not yet been arrested. In total, according to the Minister of the Interior Gérald Darmanin, 540 people were arrested and more than 400 police and gendarmes were injured.

Meanwhile, the fight continues. The 14th day of action against the pension reform will take place on June 6. This was decided after an inter-union meeting this morning. This new day of mobilization will take place two days before the bill proposed by the Liot group in the National Assembly. The purpose of the text is to repeal the controversial reform.

Thursday Emmanuel Macron will be in a high school in Saintes, in Charente-Maritime. There he will present the reform of professional high schools - A reform, which is also controversial. The teachers' unions denounce the increase in the time of internships for students.

What happened last night in the Vaucluse? Two men, in their twenties, died in a shooting in Cavaillon. At the same time, shots at the other end of the city injured another man. The investigation will have to determine if there is a link with drug trafficking.

And François Fillon will be heard this afternoon at the National Assembly as part of the commission of inquiry into foreign interference. Parliamentarians want to understand how foreign powers manage to interfere in the economy and French politics. After leaving politics, the former Prime Minister joined the boards of directors of two companies run by close associates of Vladimir Putin.
