The constitutional council has rejected a second request for a referendum on pension reform. The shared initiative referendum proposal or RIP, that was put forward by some 250 deputies and senators apparently did not meet the required criteria. The constitutional council claims that the referendum request "does not relate, in terms of Article 11 of the Constitution, to a reform relating to social policy", which was the main point that had to be proved. The left-wing alliance NUPES says that the battle will continue to withdraw the text. Unions are also calling for another day of widespread industrial action on June 6<sup>th</sup>.

Emmanuel Macron is continuing his public visits today. The President will be presenting his reform to vocational high schools in Saintes in Charente. Macron says that he wants to make the professionally-focused route one of excellence.

Two weeks after his heart attack, Jean Marie Le Pen has left hospital. His granddaughter, Marion Maréchal told Paris Première that the co-founder of the Front National is feeling better and was able to go home.

Nine people, eight of whom were teenagers were killed yesterday in a shooting at a school in Belgrade, Serbia. A young French girl is among the victims. The suspect is a 13-year-old teenager, who allegedly planned the attack by writing a list of the names of the children he wanted to kill. He has been arrested.

And finally, the videographer Squeezie has announced a 2nd edition of the GP Explorer. The Formula 4 race takes place between 9 Internet personalities. The 2nd Grand Prix will take place on September 9<sup>th</sup> at the Bugatti circuit in Le Mans.
