The objective is to reindustrialize France by 2030. It is within this context that Emmanuel Macron is in Dunkirk this afternoon. After a visit to an aluminum factory, the Head of State will formalize the future establishment of a gigafactory - a new manufacturing plant for electric car batteries. Eventually, more than 3,000 employees will be working on this site.

Also in the news, a letter from the CROUS is worrying student associations. Around 3,200 accommodation units in the Paris region will be requisitioned during the 2024 Olympic Games, in order to house staff. The Ministry of Sports ensures that students who wish to stay in Ile de France during the summer will be relocated.

A 32-year-old man was shot dead in Marseille last night. The events took place near the Old Port by a bar. 19 people have now been killed by firearm since the beginning of the year in Marseille.

And hearings are taking place in relation to the Galtier case. According to several sports media, the current coach of Nice, Didier Digard, several soccer players, as well as club employees have been heard these past days in the preliminary investigation opened against the former coach of Nice. Christophe Galtier is suspected of having made racist and Islamophobic remarks.

It is a symbolic decision in this context of drought. The prefect of Hérault issued an unfavorable opinion yesterday concerning a project to build a golf course in the town of Montagnac near Montpellier. In addition to the 18 holes, the 200-hectare estate would also have accommodated 410 luxury accommodations, some with swimming pools.

In the United States, authorities fear a "chaotic" influx. For the past few days, thousands of migrants have been rushing to the Mexican border, as last night the "title 42" expired. This measure put in place by former President Donald Trump at the start of COVID made it possible to close the American territory to foreigners.
