It's more than the requisitions: Nicolas Sarkozy was sentenced this morning on appeal to 3 years in prison, including 1 year in the so-called wiretapping case. The former President was found guilty of corruption and influence peddling. He will be able to serve his sentence at home with an electronic bracelet. Nicolas Sarkozy is also deprived of his civic rights for a period of three years. His lawyers have announced that they will appeal this decision.

Two days after the attack on Brigitte Macon's grand-nephew in Amiens ,4 people will be tried in immediate appearance: 3 adults and a 16-year-old girl. As a reminder, Jean-Baptiste Trogneux was beaten up on Monday evening by demonstrators, just after Emmanuel Macron's television interview.

The resignation of the mayor of Saint Brévin les Pins will not be validated before his meeting with Élisabeth Borne this evening. Yannick Morez has decided to throw in the towel last week - victim of pressure from the far right for having supported a reception center project for asylum seekers in his town. His house and his car had even been set on fire last March.

And Elisabeth Borne is also continuing her discussions with the unions today. After a meeting with the CFDT and Force Ouvrière last night, this time it is the turn of the CFE-CGC, the CFTC and the CGT to be received today by the Prime Minister. Social partners will most likely once again recall their opposition to the pension reform.

"Here you can be yourself". This is the message sent by this awareness campaign in middle schools and high schools to welcome LGBT + people. It was launched by the Minister of Education pap Ndyaye on the occasion the international day against homophobia and transphobia.

And then a lot of people are expected on the roads for this long weekend. Traffic is red today throughout France for departures. The first difficulties are expected very soon mainly in Ile-de-France, around the Rhône valley and in big cities.
