The trial of the attackers of Brigitte Macon's grand nephew is postponed to June 5. The 3 men are suspected of having beaten Jean-Baptiste Trogneux on Monday evening in front of his chocolate factory in Amiens. While awaiting their trial, they have been placed in pre-trial detention. A 16-year-old girl, also prosecuted in this case, must be brought before a juvenile judge.

The mayor of Saint-Brevin-les-Pins is expected at Matignon this evening. Yannick Morrez will meet at 6:30 p.m. with Prime Minister Elisabeth Borne. The elected official decided to resign after receiving numerous threats from far-right groups, and after the arson attacks on his car and his home. Before the Senate Law Commission this morning he denounced "a criminal attack". Yannick Morrez also deplored the lack of support from the state.

A tragedy took place in Vendin-le-Vieil in the Pas-de-Calais, where a 13-year-old schoolgirl committed suicide last Friday. According to La Voix du Nord, she supposedly took her own life after being the victim of school harassment. An investigation has been opened and a psychological unit was set up early this week.
