Pasta, oil, and even coffee are some of the products that will cost less in the coming months. The biggest agri-food manufacturers have undertaken to reopen trade negotiations with large retailers to bring prices down. The government has lobbied to accelerate the drop in prices on the shelves while the prices of certain products have fallen in recent months. Manufacturers have also committed to doing more promotions.

Ukraine is hit by a new wave of attacks. Bombings took place this morning in Kiev, the capital. Several explosions sounded at dawn. The order was given to the population to stay under cover. Other attacks were observed in the center of the country. They intervene as a Chinese emissary is traveling to Kiev to try to obtain a political settlement of the conflict.

The government's objective is to increase the penal sanctions in the event of attacks against elected officials. For the Minister of Territorial Communities, this infernal spiral of violence must be stopped. Dominique Faure participated in a meeting with the Prime Minister and the resigning mayor of St Brévin les pins. The government wants to align the penalty incurred with that of attacks on police officers and firefighters. That is to say 7 years in prison and a fine of 100,000 euros.

An investigation has been opened in Haute-Garonne after the desecration last Saturday of graves in a Christian and Jewish cemetery in the town of Volvestre, about thirty kilometers from Toulouse. Gérald Darmanin condemned this morning on Twitter these acts of vandalism.
