In Hiroshima, Japan, the G7 countries decided on new sanctions against Russia. Sanctions aimed at "depriving the country of technologies, industrial equipment and services of the G7". These measures include restrictions on exports of goods "essential to Russia on the battlefield", according to a statement.

In the meantime, Ukraine was again the target of air attacks last night. The whole territory has been placed under alert. Explosions were recorded in several regions. So far, no injuries or deaths have been reported.

In France, there are social protests in Cannes as the Cannes film festival unfolds. The CGT is planning a demonstration today on the forecourt of the Carlton. There are also gatherings of employees in the hotel sector. Beyond the pension reform, the union also denounces "the working conditions of a hundred Carlton employees, deprived of natural light in the basement" in the five-star luxury establishment. The labor inspectorate was seized.
