A court ordered the Keeper of the Seals and the Lille prosecutor's office to erase the personal data of detainees during the mobilization against the pension reform. A file had been compiled with the surnames, first names and dates of birth of each protester. It is a serious and illegal violation of the right to respect private life, considered the judge. The administrative court had been seized in summary proceedings by the Association for the Defense of Constitutional Freedoms, the Syndicate of Lawyers of France and the League of Human Rights.

Nearly 2000 victims of asbestos demanded a criminal trial judge those responsible. This trial will not take place, at least not for now. The Paris Criminal Court invalidated the procedure because of its "vagueness". The plaintiffs hoped for a trial against fourteen people: former representatives of ministries, business leaders and doctors, who supposedly voluntarily delayed the ban on asbestos.

Thirty thousand people gathered in the Indre for the thirty years of the Teknival. The gathering around techno music is held until Sunday on private land where 240 gendarmes are mobilized. Seventeen people have already been injured, one of which seriously.

The West wants to break Russia, says Vladimir Putin as the G7 countries meeting in Japan announced new sanctions. Western sanctions are helping to unite the Russian people rather than divide them, reacted Vladimir Putin. The G7 announced measures aimed at "depriving the country of technologies, industrial equipment and services which support the war".

As for the Ukrainian president, he will go to the G7 on Sunday to convince the Western partners to increase their military aid to Ukraine.

And in Italy the death toll continues to rise: fourteen people have died following the floods in Emilia Romagna. Evacuations of residents continued at midday. In Ravenna, authorities decreed the "urgent and immediate evacuation" of several neighborhoods.
