Elisabeth Borne will be presenting her action plan today to accelerate the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions. The Prime Minister must show that she is stepping up to the challenge of reducing the country's greenhouse gas emissions. By 2030, France hopes to make it to 270 million tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub>, bearing in mind that last year we emitted 408 tonnes. A working meeting with the national council for the ecological transition is taking place today at the Prime Minister's office at Matignon.

The Prime Minister is also due to meet a confederation of small and medium-sized enterprises and the MEDEF, the movement for France's companies, today. The meeting will certainly broach inflation as well as union demands such as repealing the reform to unemployment insurance reform.

The Minister of the Interior, Gérald Darmanin will be in Roubaix today to pay tribute to the victims of a road accident yesterday. Four people were killed, including three police officers, in the accident near Villeneuve d'Ascq. The officers were transporting a young woman to hospital. She suffered multiple fractures.

In Cannes, a woman was escorted off the red carpet yesterday after she appeared covered in fake blood and the colours of Ukraine. The incident occurred just before the screening of the film "Acide". On Wednesday evening, a feminist activist took to the red carpet to protest against surrogacy.

In football, an eleventh league title is fast approaching for PSG. Last night, Paris Saint Germain won 2-1 against Auxerre at the end of day 36 of the Ligue 1. PSG now have a 6-point lead over Lens in second place. PSG's next match is at 9pm next Saturday, against Strasbourg. A single point is all they need for PSG to become champions.

And finally, in women's football, PSG lost to Olympique Lyonnais, handing the championship to Lyon. The final score was 1-0, giving Lyon their 16<sup>th</sup> division 1 title.
