Gérald Darmanin is expected in Roubaix, following the tragedy that happened yesterday in Villeneuve d'Ascq. 3 young police officers lost their lives on the road, hit from the front by another car whose driver also died. An investigation for homicides and involuntary injuries has been opened by the Lille prosecutor's office.

How to reduce CO2 emissions? Elisabeth Borne is due to present her action plan today to accelerate the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions. As a reminder, France hopes to reach 270 million tonnes of CO2 by 2030, it had emitted 408 last year. A working meeting is taking place today at 3 p.m. in Matignon with the national council for ecological transition, which brings together NGOs, unions, employers and parliamentarians.

A report of more than 160 pages and 59 recommendations was submitted today to the Keeper of the Seals Eric Dupont Moretti and to Isabelle Rome, Minister Delegate in charge of equality between women and men to improve the legal treatment of domestic violence. The report advocates for the creation of specialized centers in courts to constitute and train teams dedicated to the treatment of cases of intra-family violence.

Several days of tense debates in the National Assembly are expected in relation to the military programming bill. A text which plans 413 billion euros in military spending until 2030 and which will be examined by MPs from 4 p.m. These debates take place at a time of great political fragility for the government - Only two months after the debates on the pension reform and in a tense international context due to the war in Ukraine.

And then between 300 and 400,000 free places are being considered by the organization of the Paris Olympic Games for the opening ceremony. This was announced by the Minister of Sports Amélie Oudéa Castéra before the Finance Committee of the National Assembly. On top of that, 100,000 tickets are expected to go on sale on the "quais bas".
