Tina Turner's star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame has turned into a shrine as fans have flocked to lay flowers and light candles after her death was announced yesterday. Tina Turner died in Switzerland at age 83 after a long illness. Social media exploded with tributes at the news of her death, including from music icons including Mick Jagger, Mariah Carey, Lionel Richie and Gloria Gaynor. The tone was unanimous, Tina Turner was "Simply the best".

Between 2 and 3,000 people gathered last night in Saint-Brévin in Loire-Atlantique. The march was organized by several left-wing parties and the association of the mayors of France to support Yannick Morez. The municipal councillor resigned after his house was set on fire and he received threats from the far right. Yannick Morez himself did not participate in the march. In a speech, he said that "All mayors need support".
