The kidnapping alert has ended. The measure was lifted this morning by the Grenoble prosecutor's office. However, Eya has still not been found. The 10-year-old girl, as we recall, was kidnapped by her father yesterday morning near her school in Fontaine in Isère. In the middle of a divorce, the parents are fighting over custody of the child. According to the prosecution, the elements collected as part of the kidnapping alert are being analyzed by investigators.

Also in the news, the hearing of the man who killed a nurse on Monday at the Reims University Hospital is postponed until September 8th. This hearing will be related to another case in 2017, when the individual had then also attacked medical personnel with a knife. It was in the Marne, in the establishment where the suspect was followed for his psychiatric disorders. The man remains in pre-trial detention. The funeral of Carène Mezino, the nurse killed last Monday will take place next Thursday in Reims.

180 Casino stores in France will soon to be taken over by Intermarché. According to the newspaper Les Echos, hypermarkets, supermarkets and a few Franprix should be sold in two stages to the group Mousquetaires. Casino entered a conciliation procedure for its debt, which amounts to more than six billion euros.
