What solutions for housing? Prime Minister Elisabeth Borne will unveil this afternoon the measures resulting from the National Refoundation Council launched at the end of November. These announcements are eagerly awaited by the actors in the sector because there is urgency for the Right to Housing.

In all, the government must announce about twenty measures on housing construction or on thermal renovation.

Also in the news, Emmanuel Macron is expected at Mont St-Michel this afternoon. On site, the President will deliver a speech during the day on the occasion of the millennium of the foundation of the abbey - symbol of "the French spirit" of "resilience" and "resistance" according to the Elysée.

The movement promises to be very popular. Tomorrow is the 14th day of mobilization against the pension reform. More than 250 gatherings are planned throughout France. Between 400 and 600,000 demonstrators are expected. SNCF traffic should not be too disrupted tomorrow, with 9 out of 10 trains in circulation on average. On the other hand, in the air, 20% of flights should be canceled at most airports and even 1 third at the airport of Paris-Orly.

Almost 6 months after the suicide of the young Lucas in the Vosges, four teenagers were found guilty today of harassment against the 13-year-old schoolboy. However, the Epinal children's court did not retain of causal link between these events and the suicide of the teenager.

And then it was 40 years ago to the day: On June 5, 1983, Yannick Noah won Roland-Garros. He is the last French tennis player to have been crowned on Parisian clay.
