Is today the last stand of unions regarding the pension reform? This is the fourteenth day of mobilization, 2 days before the discussions around the LIOT group's bill in the Assembly which aims to repeal the reform. For Murielle Guilbert, co-delegate of the Solidaires trade union, the movement will continue on the long-term.

As for Laurent Berger, he believes that this 14th day should be "one of the last" mobilizations against the pension reform. Faced with the anger of the people, the leader of the CFDT still expects "many" people in the street. Between 400 and 600,000 demonstrators are expected today.

In the rest of the news, in Dreux, a solemn march is taking place right now to pay tribute to the family, murdered on May 25th. A mother and her 2 children were stabbed to death; the ex-spouse is in custody.

Abroad, the dam of a hydroelectric power station in southern Ukraine was partially destroyed last night. Kyev accuses Moscow of having bombed the site. Major floods now threaten the region of Kherson.

Pope Francis is currently in the hospital. The sovereign pontiff is undergoing a health check in Rome according to the Ansa press agency. As a reminder, the Pope was already hospitalized last March for a lung infection.

And then in soccer: As expected, Karim Benzema is going to Saudi Arabia. The French striker has signed up for the next 3 years with the defending champion, Al-Ittihad. Karim Benzema said goodbye on Sunday to the Santiago stadium- Bernabeu, after 14 years at Real Madrid.
