The mobilization against the pension reform is at its lowest. 281,000 people were in the streets today according to the Ministry of the Interior, while the CGT claims that more than 900,000 people were present. The figures are below the expectations of the unions and the latest national mobilizations. In Paris, 31,000 demonstrators gathered according to police figures while the intersyndicale reports 300,000.

The 22-year-old man released on Monday in the case of the assault on Brigitte Macron's little nephew was present in the Parisian gathering. He was arrested near the starting point of the demonstration for carrying a prohibited weapon. According to the Parisian, it was a helmet as well as shelled gloves. It should be noted that this fourteenth day of national mobilization was punctuated with a few incidents. 28 people were arrested, as announced by the police headquarters at the very end of the day.

Harassment will be the government's top priority for the next school year. These are the words of Elisabeth Borne this afternoon at the National Assembly. "Harassment is a plague that undermines the daily lives of thousands of young people and too often results in tragedies", said the Prime Minister in reference to the death of Lindsay. Among the announcements, the Phare program will notably be extended to high schools.

In the rest of the news: a 5.7 earthquake hit western Haiti. At least three people have been found dead under the rubble in Saint Helene. For the time being, school activities are paralyzed in the city of poets.

And then Novak Djokovic is the first qualified for the last four of the Roland Garros men's singles. The Serb beat Karen Kachanov in four sets to advance to the semi-final. He will know his opponent tonight after the second quarter between Carlos Alcaraz and Stéfanos Tsitsipas. Among the ladies we know so far that Aryna Sabalenka will face Karolina Mouchova on Thursday for a place in the final.
