There is an ongoing kidnapping alert to find an 8-year-old girl who disappeared in Dunkirk overnight from Tuesday to Wednesday. She could be with her 40-year-old father. If you have any information, call 197.

Separately, the lifeless body of the 29-year-old woman who was taking care of the young girl was discovered yesterday. The other three children are safe and sound.

Also in the news, the pension reform is back today in the National Assembly. The bill of the group Liott to revoke it is being examined by the MPs. However, Yaël Bruan Pivet, the President of the Assembly, ensures that she will declare inadmissible any amendment aimed at restoring the retirement age at 62.

After a meeting deemed "disappointing" with the Minister of Education, Pap Ndiaye, Lindsay's mother believes she was very well received yesterday by Brigitte Macron. The first lady offered to be an ambassador to fight harassment. The 13 years old girl committed suicide last month in Vendin le Vieil in Pas-de-Calais, because she was the victim of school harassment.
