Annecey is in shock this evening, a few hours after a knife attack which resulted in six people injured, including four children. The attack took place this morning, in a park. Two of the children are in critical condition, as well as a retiree, who was also injured.

Prime Minister Elisabeth Borne accompanied by Interior Minister Gérald Darmanin were on site today and expressed their emotion.

As for the investigation, we are still at the very beginning. Investigators are trying to identify the profile of the main suspect arrested by the police and placed in police custody. The 31-year-old man, who is a Syrian national, does not have a criminal record nor a psychiatric history. He had obtained the status of political refugee in Sweden ten years ago. We don't know what brought him to France.

Also in the news, the girl kidnapped by her father in Dunkirk was found this afternoon in Italy, with the suspect. She is safe and sound. The kidnapping alert had been triggered last night to try to locate the 8 years old Malek. Her father's partner was found dead in her home. The Dunkirk prosecutor's office has opened an investigation for intentional homicide by a spouse and kidnapping of a minor under 15 years of age.
