Elisabeth Borne is campaigning to stay at Matignon, as the rumor of a reshuffle resurfaces. The Prime Minister does not intend to let go of her place at the head of the government. In the columns of *Le Figaro*, she recalled her determination to carry out these projects to the end. Elisabeth Borne is in Vienne today to present her Rurality Plan - A plan which aims to help the creation of shops, promote mobility and the creation of 100 medical buses for the areas in need of caregivers.

Also in Vienne, the body of a woman was found in a field near Potiers. It was a jogger who made the gruesome discovery last Tuesday. The victim was partly naked and traces on the ground were found over a distance of 20 meters, suggesting that the body had been dragged. A criminal investigation was opened.

The police custody of Karine Esquivillon's husband is extended. He is suspected of being involved in the disappearance of his wife last March in Vendée, after waiting 1 week to report her disappearance.

3 police officers were injured in Cannes, including 2 seriously. The officers were ran over last night following a refusal to comply. The driver of the two-wheeler was arrested.

In Greece, 3 days of national mourning are decreed. The country is mourning the death of 79 people in the sinking of a migrant boat during the night of Tuesday to Wednesday. The boat was carrying 750 people. A hundred migrants were saved but the emergency services fear finding other bodies.

And inflation is marking time in France. The rise in prices fell to 5.1% over one year in May according to the INSEE. A slowdown which is explained by a lower rise in energy prices and food.

And then in Basketball, the title match for Monaco or the match of hope for the Mets. Boulogne-Levallois welcomes the Principality's club to Roland Garros for the third match of the Betclic Elite final. The advantage is for the Monegasques who won the first 2 games. Kick-off at 8:30 p.m.
