Following the collapse of a building in Paris, it has been announced that around fifty people are injured, 6 of whom are in critical condition, and one person is still missing. Searches continue. As a reminder, a fire broke out yesterday at the end of the day in this building in the 5th arrondissement after an explosion. Residents say they smelled gas, but for now, the origin of the explosion has not been confirmed. An investigation for "unintentional injuries" has been opened.

Only a few hours are left to find the Titan. The race against time continues after the disappearance of this tourist submarine on Sunday in the Atlantic Ocean. 5 people, including 1 Frenchman are on board this submersible at nearly 4,000 meters deep. US Coast Guards estimate that Titan's oxygen will run out around 1:08 p.m. today.

"No country should have to choose" between the fight against poverty and the protection of the planet. These are the words this morning of Emmanuel Macron at the opening of the summit for a new financial pact. The Head of State welcomes to Paris, for 2 days, around forty heads of state, and a hundred political leaders and activists to jointly develop a reform of the international financial system. The objective is to enable developing countries to better arm themselves in the face of climate change.

And the lawyers of the *Soulèvements de la Terre* announce that they will file an appeal before the Council of State. They protest the dissolution of the environmental collective by the government which accuses it of violence. Last night rallies took place in Nantes, Lille, Montpellier and Paris to oppose the dissolution of the collective. During the demonstrations in Toulouse, the mayor of the city Jean-Luc Moudenc was taken to task by opponents. An aggression condemned by the Minister of the Interior Gerald Darmanin.
